MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF SEPTEMBER 2024



King County had **2.7 months' supply** of inventory (up from 2 in September 2023)



Snohomish County had **1.6 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.3 in September 2023)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

SEPTEMBER 2024



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$859,995** in King County and **\$760,000** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County increased 6%, from \$900,000 a year ago to **\$950,000**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 3%, from \$749,900 to **\$775,000**.

The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **43** nationally, up 7% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 44.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

4,625 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of August 31, 2024)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: 18%

6,445 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of August 31, 2024)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: -17%

The Washington unemployment rate for September 2024 is **4.8%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **4.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 4,700** between September 2023 and September 2024. Total employment in construction is **236,600 statewide**.
