#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF FEBRUARY 2019



King County had **2.09 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.88 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.63 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.83 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

### MEDIAN HOME PRICE

FEBRUARY 2019



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$604,000** in King County and **\$454,995** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 0.78 percent, from \$649,950 a year ago to **\$655,000**. The median price in Snohomish County fell 2.07 percent, from \$485,000 to **\$474,947**.

In Seattle, the median single family home price for February was \$730,000, a 6.05 percent decrease from February 2018.

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

## **JOBS**

Between 2010 and 2017, the Puget Sound Region added 362,800 jobs. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for February 2019 is 4.5% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington rose by 8,300 between January 2019 and February 2019. Total employment in construction is **219,600 statewide**.
