MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF SEPTEMBER 2019



King County had **2.17 months' supply** of inventory
(down from 2.83 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.72 months' supply** of inventory
(down from 2.18 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

SEPTEMBER 2019



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$593,750** in King County and **\$470,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County fell 1.20%, from \$668,000 a year ago to **\$660,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 1.55%, from \$484,995 to **\$492,500**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for September was **\$750,000**, a 3.23% decrease from September 2018.

POPULATION

The Puget Sound region's population as of April 1, 2019 was **4,198,400**.

Over the past year, the region added 63,740 people, as follows:

- King County +36,100
- Kitsap County +2,980
- Pierce County +11,080
- Snohomish County +13,580

BUILDING PERMITS

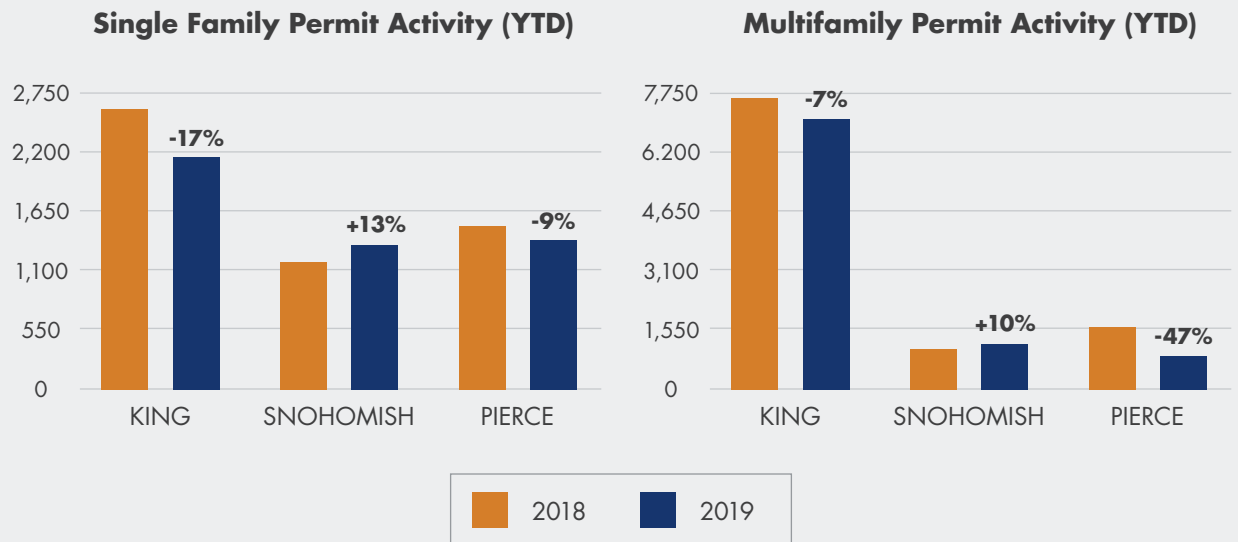
The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

11,020 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of August 31, 2019)

YTD % Change Compared to 2018: **-12%**

JOBS

Since 2010, the Puget Sound Region has added more than 464,000 jobs. We've added over 2.75 jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for September 2019 is 4.6% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.0%**.

Construction employment in Washington increased by 700 between August 2019 and September 2019. Total employment in construction is **223,800 statewide**.
