## Homing in on Our Region's Housing Statistics

JANUARY 2019

### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF NOVEMBER 2018



King County had **2.32 months' supply** of inventory  
(up from 0.79 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **2.05 months' supply** of inventory  
(up from 0.89 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

### MEDIAN HOME PRICE

IN NOVEMBER 2018



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$605,000** in King County and **\$450,000** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 2.09 percent, from \$630,750 a year ago to **\$643,913**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 5.62 percent, from \$445,000 to **\$470,000**.

In Seattle, the median single family home price for November was **\$760,000**, a 2.52 percent increase from November 2017.

### POPULATION

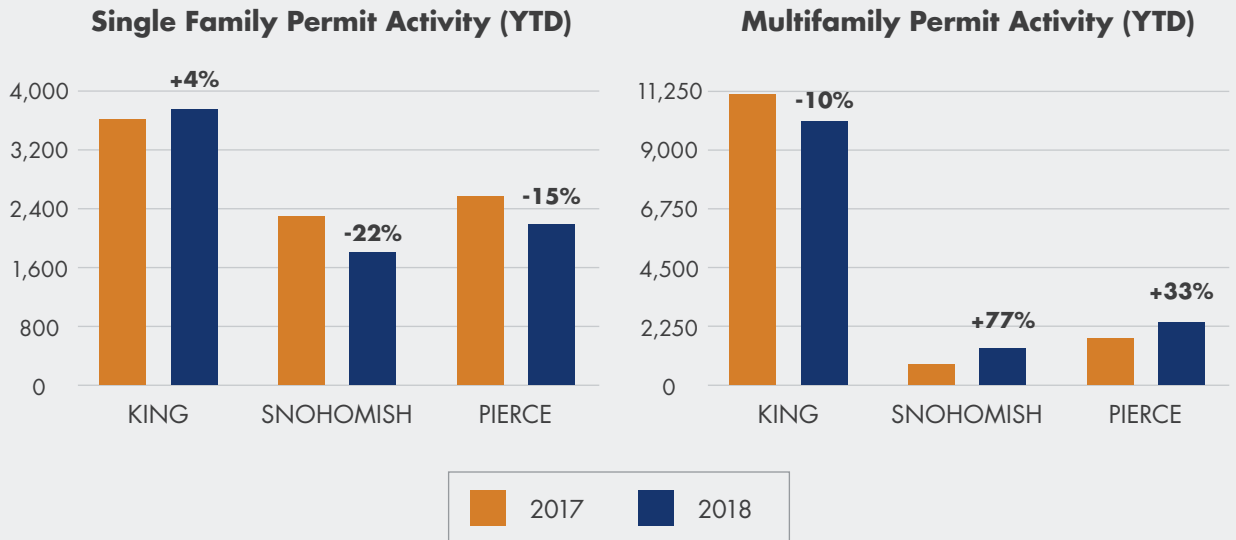
## BUILDING PERMITS

The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

**7,763 Single Family Permits** (YTD as of October 31, 2018)  
YTD % Change Compared to 2017: **-9%**

**13,901 Multifamily Permits** (YTD as of October 31, 2018)  
YTD % Change Compared to 2017: **+1%**

## JOBS

Between 2010 and 2017, the Puget Sound Region added 362,800 jobs. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for November 2018 is 4.3% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.3%**.

Construction employment in Washington fell by 1,100 between October 2018 and November 2018. Total employment in construction is **213,000 statewide**.
