#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY AS OF MAY 2020



King County had **1.74 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.71 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.35 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.47 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

# MEDIAN HOME PRICE

MAY 2020



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$627,000** in King County and **\$493,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County fell 4.00%, from \$700,000 a year ago to **\$672,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 3.21%, from \$499,950 to **\$516,000**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for May was **\$765,000**, a 2.54% decrease from May 2019.

## POPULATION

The Puget Sound region's population as of April 1, 2019 was 4,198,400.




#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

**2,541 Single-Family Permits** (YTD as of April 30, 2020) YTD % Change Compared to 2019: **-1%** 

**4,184 Multifamily Permits** (YTD as of April 30, 2020) YTD % Change Compared to 2019: **-26%**

### JOBS

Since 2010, the Puget Sound Region has added more than 464,000 jobs. We've added over 2.75 jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for May 2020 is **15.1%** and for Seattle/ Bellevue/Everett it is **14.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington increased by 30,000 between April 2020 and May 2020. Total employment in construction is **196,000 statewide**.
