#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF MAY 2018



King County had **1.12 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.76 months of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.00 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.91 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

# MEDIAN HOME PRICE

IN MAY 2018



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$650,000** in King County and **\$478,615** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 14.64 percent, from \$633,500 a year ago to **\$726,275**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 11.11 percent, from \$450,000 to **\$500,000**.

In Seattle, the median single family home price for May was **\$830,000**, a 13.85 percent increase from May 2017.

### **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish and Pierce counties).

**3,179 Single Family Permits** (YTD as of April 30, 2018)

YTD % Change Compared to 2017: +4%

**5,396 Multifamily Permits** (YTD as of April 30, 2018)

YTD % Change Compared to 2017: +15%

#### **JOBS**

Between 2010 and 2017, the Puget Sound Region added 362,800 jobs. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington Unemployment Rate for April 2018 is 4.7% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.7%**.

Construction employment in Washington rose by 1,400 between April 2018 and May 2018. Total employment in construction is **210,200 statewide**.
